SEPARATION OF CITY AND COUNTY INTERCEPTORS**

Sealed Bids for Contract No. 117 for the Delaware No. 1 Water Pollution Control Facility Separation of City and County Interceptors will be received by The Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority office, located at 1645 Ferry Avenue, Camden, New Jersey 08104 until 10:00 a.m. (Local Time), on **December 4, 2018**, and then at said office publicly opened and read aloud.

The Work comprises of furnishing all labor, materials, equipment and services required for:

1. Construct separate City Interceptor running parallel to the existing Junction Chamber and connect directly to the Preliminary Treatment Facility (PTF) before the Bar Screens.
2. Construct separate junction/flow metering chamber on the redirected City Interceptor.

The Contract Documents consist of Advertisement for Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Bid, Bid Bond, Agreement, General Conditions, Supplementary Conditions, Payment Bond, Performance Bond, Drawings, Specifications and Addenda. All bidders must obtain a set of the Contract Documents.

Return of the documents is not required, and the amount paid for the documents is non-refundable.

Each Bid must be accompanied by a certified or bank cashier's check made payable to Owner, or a Bid Bond in the form provided in the Contract Documents, issued by a surety licensed to conduct business in the State of New Jersey and having a Best Rating of A- or better from A.M. Best Company and named in the current list of "Companies Holding Certificates of Authority as Sureties on Federal Bonds and as Acceptable Reinsuring Companies" as published in Circular 570 (amended) by the Financial Management Service, Surety Bond Branch, U.S. Department of the Treasury, in an amount not less than 10 percent of the amount of the Bid submitted, but not in excess of \$20,000, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-21. The list may be ordered from the Government Printing Office Bookstore, 26 Federal Plaza, Room 110, New York, NY 10278, (212) 264-3825.

The successful Bidder must furnish a 100 percent construction performance bond, and a 100 percent construction payment bond, a maintenance bond, and an environmental maintenance bond with a surety company acceptable to the Owner and the necessary insurance certificates as prescribed in the General Conditions and the Supplementary Conditions upon the execution of the Agreement. Complete instruction for preparing Bids and a maintenance bond are included in the Bidding Documents.

Bidders are advised that this Contract is funded in part with funds from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure financing programs and the successful bidder must comply with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 7:22-9 for the participation of small business enterprises owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals, as follows:

1. The invitation to bid is on an unrestricted basis whereby the successful bidder must fulfill the SED utilization requirements. The agencies specified in N.J.A.C. 7:22-9.13(a)8 will have a list of eligible SED firms and shall, upon request, provide them to the project sponsor. The project sponsor will, during the advertisement phase, provide copies of the list to all contractors on unrestricted contracts.
2. Neither the United States nor the State of New Jersey, nor any of their departments, agencies or employees is or will be a party to this contract.
3. Bidders are required to comply with all relevant Federal and State Statutes, Rules and Regulations as described in Bidding Documents.

Bidders shall be required to comply with the provisions of the following State Laws and Regulations:

10. Public Works Contractor Registration Act (N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.48 et. seq)
11. Foreign Corporation Law (N.J.S.A. 14A:13.3)
12. Use of Domestic Materials (N.J.S.A. 52:33-1 to 52:33-3)
13. Prompt Payment Law (N.J.S.A. 2A:30A-2 et seq.)
14. Procedures and requirements of the Loan (N.J.A.C. 7:22-3.1, 4.1, and 5.1)
15. Environmental Assessment Requirements (N.J.A.C. 7:22-10.11)
16. Construction of Environmental Infrastructure Facilities (N.J.A.C. 7:14.2)

Bidders are advised that this Contract shall comply with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-45 and as such the Contract to be awarded is a qualified small business enterprise set-aside contract, qualified veteran business enterprise set-aside contract, a qualified minority business enterprise set-aside contract or a qualified women's business enterprise set-aside contract, as appropriate.

In order to perform public work, the Successful Bidder and Subcontractors prior to contract award shall hold or obtain such licenses as required by State Statutes, and Federal and local Laws and Regulations.

Bidders are required to execute a non-collusive bidding certification (Affidavit) in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-15.

The attention of Bidders is particularly called to the requirements as to the conditions of employment to be observed and the minimum wage rates to be paid under the contracts as determined by the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development. Please remember that this is a New Jersey Prevailing Wage job. The contractor shall pay not less than the prevailing wage rate to workers employed in the performance of any contract for the project, in accordance with the rate determined by the Commissioner of New Jersey Department of Labor pursuant to N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.25 et seq. OR the United States Secretary of Labor pursuant to 29 CFR Part 5, whichever is greater. For the actual "Wage Determination Letter," you should contact the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development

Bidders are required to comply with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.51, The Public Works Contractor Registration Act (PWCRA). No contractor shall bid on any contract for public work as defined in section 2 of P.L. 1963, c. 150 (C. 34:11-56.26) unless the contractor is registered pursuant to this act. No contractor shall list a subcontractor in a bid proposal for the contract unless the subcontractor is registered pursuant to P.L. 1999, c. 238 (C. 34:11-56.48 et seq.) at the time the bid is made.

Bidders are also required to comply with the requirements of Affirmative Action Compliance (N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 17:27 at seq.).

The Commissioners of the CCMUA require the successful Bidder to prove the necessity of any change order(s). Therefore, please pre-examine everything before submitting your bid. Where the nature or amount of change orders cause suspicion that they are being submitted to purposely inflate your bid, the CCMUA will decline payment and refer the activity to the appropriate law enforcement authorities.

The Commissioners will take the same approach to any other subsequent request for increases to the contract price.

The Owner reserves the right to reject all of the Bids received, to re-advertise for Bids, to abandon the project, to waive any or all minor informalities in any Bid received and to accept any proposal all in accordance with applicable law."

A pre-bid meeting will be held at The Camden County Municipal Utilities Authority on **November 13, 2018** at 10 A.M. Even though the pre-bid meeting is not mandatory, it is highly recommended that all bidders attend the pre-bid meeting.
