Proposals are due no later than Friday April 17, 2020 at 2:00 PM. No Proposals will be accepted after the above referenced date. Proposals must be submitted in sealed envelopes with "Camden County Events Vending Services" marked on the outside of the envelope. Proposals may not be faxed, e-mailed or transmitted over the telephone.

It is recommended that each proposal be hand delivered to the Division of Purchasing. The County assumes no responsibility for delays in any form of carrier, mail or delivery service causing the proposal to be received at the Division of Purchasing later than the above-referenced date.
